

#### **Upcoming 2022 Projects:**

The Village of Elmwood Park has a few different planned projects for 2022.

At the Taylor Complex, leftover 2021 infrastructure funds are being used to reconstruct the Taylor Complex municipal driveway. This will replace the existing drive, increase parking for tenants and events, and extend the drive from the Southside of the property to the North. Also at the Taylor Complex, we are currently investigating with an architect a plan to replace windows throughout the buildings. Doing so will decrease long-term energy costs for the property. The Taylor Complex makes up ~45% of the Village's income streams that help to offset the tax base. These projects make up solid investments to increase the value and utilization of the property moving forward.

Also, with leftover funding from the 2021 road construction project, we plan to crack fill and clean up areas in the remainder of the Village not yet tackled with complete reconstruction. We are hopeful these repairs will extend the life of these roads as we await the appropriate timing to complete phases 2 and 3 of the village-wide road and utility reconstruction projects.

Finally, we are well-aware of the lamp system outages throughout the Village. Multiple breaks in the system have been discovered by our electrical contractor, RIC Electric. Because of this, we are investigating both short-term and long-term solutions. Long-term solutions may involve re-wiring the entire system from lamp to lamp. Thank you for your patience as we learn about all our options and determine the most cost-effective solution for our Village.
